

Tipping at All Inclusive Resorts

The two most frequent questions we get on this topic are "how much cash should I bring for tips?" and "do I need to bring USD or exchange for local currency?".

In general, for a typical week-long vacation, you should **budget roughly \$15 - \$20 daily** for tips, in small bills (ones and fives, with an occasional ten or twenty for above-and-beyond service).

And for *most* resorts USD is acceptable (and even desired) but a very few destinations won't accept USD so be sure to ask in advance for your specific destination.

GETTING THERE:

- Transfer Driver: \$3-\$5 for the trip, plus \$1 per piece of luggage for baggage assistance, more if your bags are very heavy or don't roll;
- Bellman: \$1 per piece of luggage for delivery, an extra Room service: \$2-\$3 per order; \$2-\$3 if they store your luggage for any extended length of time;

SERVICES:

- Housekeeping: \$2 daily, leave it daily in an envelope clearly marked "for housekeeping"
- Mini Bar: Not necessary for normal restocking, but tip \$2-\$3 if you request items or need more than 1x daily restocking;
- Concierge: \$5 \$10 depending on services, same goes for the Butler if you utilize one;

WHEN DINING:

- At the Buffet: \$1-\$2 per meal, if you have something made-to-order at a station, an extra \$1 to tip the chef;
- A la carte: \$2-\$3 per meal;
- At the bars: \$1 every few drinks per individual, or \$1-\$3 per round for group orders (the larger the group, the bigger the tip);

AT THE POOL AND BEACH:

- Bartender: if ordering right at the bar, \$1 every few drinks per individual or \$1-\$3 per round of group orders;
- Beach/Pool Server: same as above, add an extra \$1 or more if also delivering food, or if you have a large group, more if your group is obnoxious;

SPA, SALON, & SPECIAL EVENTS:

If your vaction includes getting pampered at the resort Spa, be sure to tip your service provider(s) 15% - 20% of the cost of the service, even if you're using resort credits for the service itself.

Remember, tipping is never required at any all-inclusive, and rarely expected. In fact, at some all inclusive resorts, tipping is not allowed, so know the policies before you go.
